

VIAGRA ART AND ITS SPIRIT

 \mathbf{P} rintmaking is perhaps the only discipline within visual arts that has held onto its traditional conventions. It has strong traditions in production: of using certain types of media as a work's master copy, and where the final product, as a matter of principle, is printed. As the discipline itself emerged as a response to artists' boredom with older mediums, it was natural and necessary to explore other materials and employ more specific techniques, such as lithography, etching, mezzotint, aquatint, linocut, woodcut, serigraphy/silk screen, and stencilling. The latter three of which are used much more commonly than the others. At ISI Yogyakarta and ITB, the usage of these techniques came into prominence in the decades between the 1960s and 1990s. The particular characteristics of each printed edition, produced by a certain technique or combinations of techniques became important considerations to the continued existence and competitiveness of printmaking. Meanwhile, the discipline further developed to challenge its own conventions. As a result, it was no longer a given that a finished print work to be just what is printed on the paper medium; the print may also be combined with collaging and acrylic or oil painting. Monoprints on canvas, or even masters often became the artwork itself. This tendency appeared in the 1990s to 2000s.

In this new phase, printmaking further developed and differentiated itself. Choice of printmaking material was completely freed from traditional printmaking code of ethics. All editions and print series are now considered original works, whereas previously artists would produce and distinguish between different editions or duplicates printed on paper. This happened at the same time as the rise of contemporary art, where conventions were broken down and the principle of "anything goes" – rooted in post-modern art discourse – is taken towards many different directions. Printmaking techniques eventually spread to other art disciplines as a result of adaptation to technological developments, namely digital printing. The implication being how the principle of "printing" began to be used in various media, often slipping into painting, sculpture, installation, graffiti, murals, bricolage, mixed media, among others. Professional visual artists, art students, and self-taught artists practice this crossmedia pollination or integration, taking advantage of the wealth of printmaking techniques to build artwork-making strategies towards exceptional artistic achievement.

Printmaking thrives at ISI Yogyakarta, even though print exhibitions are rarely held outside campus. Miracle Print and Bentara Budaya have periodically organised the Jogja International Miniprint Biennale and Triennial printmaking competitions – at least during pre-pandemic times. Such competitions consistently safeguard the traditions and conventions found within graphic arts. Meanwhile, within the realm of Indonesian fine arts, non-conventional printmaking has significantly developed, especially with the widespread adoption of its practices within art school campuses. Unfortunately, such variants and extensions of printmaking techniques rarely receive significant exposure as there is little market demand for these works. Still, even within a heavily-saturated contemporary art scene, printmaking remains an effective instrument for conveying ideas, aesthetics and artistic means; a media choice no less interesting than more conventional forms of fine art.

In essence, this is how artists have a commitment to exploring their chosen medium, as shown by the artists in this exhibition, both the choice of using media, techniques and ideas. This kind of spirit was re-interpreted by the Canda printmaking group (Mahendra Pampam, Angga Sukma Permana, Putra Eko, Fikri and Andika). Inspired by the widespread use of the term "Viagra" (performance-enhancing drug), the Canda group regards printmaking as a spring from which they extract a desire to create. It gives the impression that printmaking necessitates a 'drive' in its intention, continuity, and approach towards materiety as well as technique; not all too dissimilar to the 'drive' that the eponymous drug provides. The Canda group presents their exhibition concept under the sheath of mockery. The group's members are graduates of the fine arts department of ISI Yogyakarta, which has a tradition of students mocking each other with non-serious insults that serve to awaken the creative spirit. Seniors and juniors directing personal jokes and criticism of their art at each other helps build an atmosphere of camaraderie and invigorating creative drive among students. It is this tradition that will help the Canda group in forging maturity and immunity to the criticism and ridicule they may receive in their professional careers.

The first artist in the Canda group is Mahendra Pampam. His works for this exhibition centers the journey of life and uses natural symbols, particularly human figures, animals, and bodily organs. According to Pampam, the path of a person's life is determined by their own actions, as well as by influences from their environment. Many environmental factors play a dominant role in shaping personality, which in turn directs life choices. The creation of the work entitled Genesis coincides with the birth of Pampam's second child. This event is a milestone in his life's journey, a moment guided by and full of hope and love. Both of Pampam's works are made of hardboard cut wood colored with acrylics and smeared with printing ink.

Meanwhile, Andika uses monotype or blueprint techniques. His work depicts a horse, a symbol of masculinity, against a backdrop of a sturdy old building, a figure of the 19th-century painter Raden Saleh, flying birds, and female figures. The work is about how masculinity and femininity are not simply a matter of gender but also about how people use the traits associated with them to respond to the world, with its many cultures and situations. Traditionally masculine traits: courage, assertiveness, freedom, strong personality or even aggression are distinguished from feminine traits, although in this post-emancipation era masculine traits can also be found in women, particularly in independent modern people living in big cities as career women. The combination of masculine and feminine is part of the social construct known as androgyny. In Andika's view, this phenomenon is a trend in contemporary society, a societal reality whose facts cannot be avoided but confronted and adapted to.

Technology has significantly affected the human ability to survive: the cognitive response and skill of adapting to physical change. Civilization has grown by leaps and bounds. The needs of daily life are fulfilled easily. Machines, computers, and the internet are indispensable to everyday life. Exploration and mastery are celebrated, but their impact comes at a high price. That is the allegory of Angga Sukma Permana's Rupadhatu, named after the second tier of Buddhist cosmology which represents human existence which on one hand is bound to worldly problems, and on the other attempts to release from these bonds in pursuit of the essence of life. This is symbolized in Angga's work by a solemn, contemplative figure sitting cross-legged with two arms outstretched in the opposite direction from another set of arms (suggesting ambiguity) holding a cellphone (representing how technology puts the world in the palm of our hands). Beneath the figures are elements of the Kamadatu. This work uses harboardcut and handcolouring techniques on canvas.

Putra Eko, who uses the same art techniques explores the main ideas and anxieties behind about urbanized life and culture. Eko has observed the impact of industry on the environment (environmental pollution) – improper waste disposal and air pollution that harms the health and safety of urban and global communities. Global warming melting the North and South poles, rising sea levels, and nuclear accidents are well-documented on television news. While there have been various efforts to mitigate global disasters, saving the Earth from destruction is a mission that is rarely heeded by large corporations due to their own competing interests. Eko describes this condition with the textures of urban building walls packed extremely tightly together in a narrow space. Cities are made up of groups of people bound by social contracts based on agreements between individuals with complex relationships. They all work together for their survival and livelihood. Fikri re-examines the human existence, the conditions of which have become unclear due to humans' own behaviors. He feels that many human relationships lead to disappointments, that today's society is filled with things that cannot be completely trusted. With his work entitled *Abang janji akan berubah* (I promise to change), Fikri points out the faults in human nature. His visual work is satirical, depicting a monkey shaving his own hair, wanting to change his very nature, despite the inevitable disappointment.

What these graphic artists are conveying are actually responses resulting from their sensitivity to their individual experiences and views on daily life – thoughts accumulating in the mind and anchored to the soul, then made to form meaningful aesthetics. The works Kelompok Canda are presenting help us read more deeply into contemporary issues, as they reflect the artists' concern for the environment, self, and social relationships.

CLOWNING THROUGH PRINTMAKING

The Canda group is made up of five artists who use various media in their creations: painting, sculpture, and printmaking. This exhibition in particular showcases their print works. In Indonesia, printmaking is an important and widely-practiced branch of modern art. Printmaking is usually juxtaposed with other branches of fine art, namely painting and sculpture. Painting and sculpture are very broadly defined, usually hinging only on dimensional aspects: namely painting being two-dimensional, and sculpture three-dimensional. In contrast, printmaking is defined by its techniques: high-relief, flat printing, low-relief, and screenprint. In addition to how a print work can be multiplied into several editions. The ability to reproduce works is one of the important measures of a printmaker's skill and artistry.


Works produced through printmaking methods take on different characteristics as determined by the specific choice of technique. For example, high relief techniques on woodcut prints produce certain line and plane characters because its way of etching lines is different from that in other printmaking techniques. Lines in woodcuts are made by the engraver pushing a chisel over the plane of the wood so that the lines are formed not by pulling and sweeping the hand, but by forward motion. Likewise, flat printing, low relief, and screenprinting techniques, have their own particular methods of manipulating the media used to print their works.

Member artists of the Canda group tend to explore printmaking according to their individual ability in building unique visual character through an array of different printmaking techniques. The Canda group does not consider printmaking an artistic discipline that is limited by certain specific techniques, tools, and materials. Instead, they use printmaking methods freely to make artworks that blur the boundaries between printmaking and other art disciplines. For example, carved woodblocks pasted onto twodimensional painted canvas. Canda group members were born around the mid-1980s. They entered the art world at a time when contemporary art discourse had already become part of the conversation and practice in artistic circles. As such, Canda group members' methods of artistic creation are not fixated on any particular individual techniques, rather employing mixes of several different techniques in the creation of a single work.

This group, as the name implies, emerged from its members' friendship and habit of making fun of one another. They first became friends during their time at ISI Yogyakarta and remained friends after graduation and the establishment of their individual studios.

They've gathered not to attempt to carry out any particular big idea, but to form a tight-knit community based on similarities and personal compatibility, where they can freely share their experiences and knowledge not only in matters of art, but also life in general. The members' art education backgrounds are not all exactly the same, even though they are all alumni of the fine arts department of ISI Yogyakarta. Some are mainly interested in painting, some in printmaking, and others in sculpture.

Though each Canda artist has his own artistic style, one thing they all have in common is the tendency for narrative in their work. Their desire to tell stories is evident in how they combine various figures and objects in their works, forming a particular story. The themes that emerge from their works are everyday themes close to each artist's heart, viewed through the lens of their respective personal perspectives and responses. THE ARTWORKS


