Gula uses a simpler way of creating the visuals of his works to translate back to his childhood memories as this creates a nostalgic feeling. Gula's mind retains indelible imprints and cherished memories from his early days as a child, a period in which unbridled imagination and an unadulterated worldview shaped his perspective.

The characters and visual elements that may look naive or simple reflect his perspectives as a kid, where everything seems magical and limitless. Every stroke in his paintings has a deeper meaning into it. Thus, when others ascribe these works as childlike, they are essentially taking a glimpse out of Gula's imaginary world that ruminates over his early years. 
